## The Spring Lecture – Ministry in the Falklands

The return of our annual Spring Lecture was a muchanticipated and very well-attended evening. This year's lecture was kindly given by our Rector, the Reverend Nicholas Mercer, who gave us all a fascinating insight into The Parish of the Falkland Islands, where he spent a year as Rector of the Falkland Islands, before arriving at Bolton Priory.

Nicholas shared his experiences of this South Atlantic outpost, and took us all on a journey around these remote islands, delving into their history, politics and churchmanship. In addition to his intriguing insights into the unique challenges of ministry within the island setting, his reflections on the relationships between the UK Government, those who take up temporary contractor posts, and the Islanders were most enlightening. His slide show illustrated his points beautifully, and we all enjoyed a glimpse into the living conditions, and can all now appreciate the need for corrugated roofing throughout the Islands, due to the regularity of storm force winds!











## Commemorating the Falklands War



Continuing the Falkland Islands theme, we bring news of a fantastic fundraising effort by one of our newer Life Members, Simon Mercer (brother of the Rector). Simon visited his brother in the Falkland Islands and met a number of ex-servicemen who have settled there. Having been moved by their stories and experiences, Simon wanted to support them in some way.

To mark the 40th anniversary of the start of the war, which claimed the lives of 255 British military personnel, Simon commissioned 255 bottles of commemorative whiskey and designed special labels which have been signed by Nigel Phillips (current Governor of the Falkland Islands) and Major General Julian Thompson, who led 3 Commando Brigade during the conflict with Argentina. Many bottles were also signed by Falklands veterans and high profile individuals, including Sara Jones (widow of Lt. Col. H Jones). The bottles were sold by online auction earlier this month, and Simon was delighted to have raised over £25,000 for the Falklands Veterans Foundation and the South Atlantic Medal Association.
